

- Collaborated with many new and old community partners
- Had multiple fundraising events with partners, both new and existing

- Helped raise awareness about the proposed offshore wind port project




Educational Programs

- In 2022, FOSI opted to offer a hybrid model of programming. We continued hosting remote virtual learning events, creating reservable activity kits, and installing self-guided StoryWalks, but we were thrilled to be able to bring back some in-person programs as well.
- Over the course of 2022, we offered 11 public programs (a combination of in-person on Sears Island, and Zoom presentations), with over 900 participants.



In-Person Programs

- Our in-person programs included beach yoga, a children's nature art workshop, and a guided trees walk.
- WABI TV came out to the island and did a news story on the butterfly tagging workshop we had in August.










Virtual Programs

 Virtual programs continued to be an excellent way to reach our audience, particularly in the colder months.
 We offered presentations on winter birding, the browntail moth in Waldo County, an informational session about the proposed offshore wind project, and a nature photography program.









Activity Kit Program

- We created 290 activity kits for families, focused on seven different themes, including Outdoor Survival, Earth Day, Ecosystems and Terrarium Building, and Ocean Explorers.
- These continued to be very popular and a great way for families to pick up nature-based educational content to learn together at home at their leisure.

Our March activity kit will include materials to get you started on building your own terrarium at home. These self-sustaining mini ecosystems for plants are a great way to learn about the water cycle, and they are fun to make! This kit will include pebbles, activated charcoal, and potting soil to create the right environment for your plants, as well as some figurines to live inside your mini-world. You'll just need a recycled jar or soda bottle from home, and a willingness to dig up some moss and small backyard plants outdoors once the snow melts! Project instructions and information about ecosystems and the water cycle will also be included.





 We offered four StoryWalks on Sears Island in partnership with Carver Memorial Library in 2022, one in each season.









- Two of the biggest event highlights of 2022 had to be hosting our summer and winter Solstice by the Sea celebrations again, each of which drew hundreds of people to Sears Island!
- Our summer solstice celebration included hula hooping, giant bubbles, ice cream, activity stations presented by Carver Memorial Library and the Penobscot Marine Museum, poetry readings, and a festive parade with a crowd following a large smiling sun effigy.
- On the winter solstice, hundreds of people enjoyed a walking loop lined with luminarias and a StoryWalk of a book about the shortest day of the year, as well as cocoa, cookies, music, and a decorated tree with free ornaments to take home.






































Website Redesign





Website Redesign

- With a grant from the Wild Blue Fund at Maine Community Foundation, we were able to complete an overhaul of our website.
- Our goal was to update the design, simplify navigation, and make it easier for a volunteer to keep it up to date. We completely reviewed, updated, and edited all content and added a few new features, including a video virtual tour of the island.
- Pica, a marketing, brand identity, and web design firm in Belfast worked with us in the spring and the site was launched in June.
- We also added a new "Activity & Education Resources" section, where we can post PDFs of all activity kit handouts for families, teachers, and other organizations to access.



Trails Report

We are fortunate to have a dedicated group of trail maintenance volunteers who do their best to keep them safe and in good condition. Over the past year, our crew:

- Removed many browntail moth winter nests near our kiosk on the paved road
- Trimmed trails back and weed-whacked grasses
- Added "You are here" signs and new trail name signs to make our trails more navigable and safe
- Began rebuilding some old bridges, but also adding new sections of bridges
- Cleared trees fallen across trails with chainsaws, after powerful storms















Volunteer Report

- Volunteers are the backbone of our organization, and we depend on them to do a multitude of tasks. Last year, the FOSI Board and Advisory Group put in 2,455 hours of volunteer work for FOSI, which is almost 23% more than the year before!
- Other volunteers from the community help out too. In 2022, Searsport High School's Experiential Learning Program, the Unity Homeschool Group, and individual volunteers helped with trail work and beach cleanups.





Fundraising Activities

- FOSI held several fundraising events this past year, raising \$3645.00.
- Many of our fundraisers were collaborations with local businesses, such as benefit dinners held at Nautilus and Rio's Spiked Cafe, and a scone mix fundraiser with The Scone Goddess. FOSI was also a recipient of funds raised from The Green Store's Anniversary Fundraiser and received donations from a special promotion that The Parsonage Gallery ran on the sales of paintings to FOSI members.
- Bill and Jill Kulbe sold nearly all the leftover goods from last year's yard sale, and Marge Knuuti finished selling the rest.
- Our summer and winter solstice events netted \$740.00 and \$843.00 respectively.






Clouds over the gap, October view to Sears Island and Northport, from the Sears Island Causeway, Maine



Financial Review

- This year we received two unexpected and very generous grants from the Jewish Communal Fund that has put FOSI in a solid position at the end of the year. The purpose of the grants is to support the Outreach Coordinator position. Without those grants, we would have ended the year with a deficit.
- This points out the urgency of engaging new individual and business donors, encouraging our current donors to increase their support, and identifying and applying for new grant opportunities.
 Without growth in contributed income, FOSI cannot become fully sustainable.






What's on the Horizon?

In the year ahead, we'll tackle some exciting new work and continue with ongoing projects that are important to keep the organization sustainable, including:

- Replacing the stairs to the eastern beach
- Rerouting trails to prevent erosion of a shoreline bank
- Working with a local art gallery and other artists in the area to hold at least one fundraising event
- Making a plan to manage the invasive species on the island
- Producing a rack card to replace our brochure
- Creating a plan to monitor visitor numbers and use on a long-term basis
- Expanding our membership base and increasing our income stream to fund our diverse programs and projects
